Q. What took place that night?

A. Jesus was born and they laid Him in a manger.

Q. How was the birth of Jesus announced to the world?

A. Angels heralded the good news to the shepherds.

Q. Why were the shepherds afraid?

A. A great light appeared.

Q. What did the angel announce to the shepherds?

A. Do not be afraid. I bring you good news.

Q. What was the good news?

A. Tonight in the City of David a Savior is born.

Q. Where would the shepherds find the Christ?

A. Laying in a manger.

Luke 2:25 – Luke 2:36

Q. What happened when the child was one week old?

A. His parents had Him circumcised and called Him Jesus.

Q. After forty days, where did Joseph and Mary take Jesus?

A. They took Him to Jerusalem to sacrifice a pair of doves.

Q. Who met them at the temple?

A. An old man named Simeon and Anna the prophetess.

Q. What did the Holy Spirit promise Simeon?

A. He would not die until he saw the promised Messiah.

Q. What declaration did Simeon make, as he held Jesus?

A. Now I can die in peace, as I have seen with my own eyes, Your salvation.

The Wise Men Matthew 2:1 -17

Q. What were the wise men from the East searching for?

A. The new born King.

Q. What guided them to Jerusalem?

A. A star.

Q. What did Herod do when he heard a king was born?

A. He called for the Chief Priest and Teachers of the law.

Q. What did Herod ask the Chief Priests?

A. Where will the Messiah be born?

Q. What did Herod ask the wise men in secret?

A. When exactly did the star first appear?

Q. What did Herod request the wise men to do?

A. When you find the child, report back to me.

Q. What false promise did Herod make to them?

A. I want to come and worship Him also.

Q. What happen after they departed from Herod?

A. The star went before them and stood over where Jesus was.

Q. What three gifts did the wise men give Jesus?

A. Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh.

Q. Why were they warned in a dream, not to return to Herod?

A. Herod wanted to kill Jesus.

Q. What did an angel say to Joseph in a dream?

A. Take the child and his mother to Egypt and stay there until I tell you to return.

Q. What did Herod order after he realized, the wise men returned home a different way?

A. He ordered all boys from Bethlehem under two years old to be killed.

Q. What did Mary say when they found Jesus?

Q. Did His parent's understand what Jesus meant?

A. *No.*

Q. How did Jesus behave, when they went back to Nazareth?

A. *He was obedient to his parents.*

Q. Did Mary remember all these things?

A. *Yes, she kept all these things in her heart.*

John the Baptist Prepares the Way

Matthew 3:1-12 and Luke 3:1-18

Q. Who was John the Baptist in relation to Jesus?

A. *His cousin.*

Q. Where did John the Baptist live?

A. *In the desert.*

Q. What clothes did John wear?

A. *Clothes made from camel hair and a leather belt.*

Q. What food did John eat in the desert?

A. *Locusts and wild honey.*

Q. What happened to John the Baptist in the desert?

A. *God spoke to him.*

Q. What was John known to do in the wilderness?

A. *He preached to the Jewish people.*

Q. What was his message?

A. *Turn from your sin. Be baptized in water and God will forgive you.*

Q. Who in the Old Testament prophesied that John would come.

A. *The Prophet Isaiah*

Q. Where did the people come from to be baptized?

A. *They came from all over the countryside.*

Q. What did John say about the Messiah?

A. *“I am not the Messiah, there is one coming after me who is greater than I.”*

Q. What did John declare about himself?

A. *I come to baptize you with water.*

Q. What would Jesus baptize with?

A. *Jesus would baptize with the Holy Ghost and fire.*

Baptism of Jesus

Matthew 3:13 - 17 Mark 1:9-12

Q. Who came to be baptized by John in the River Jordan?

A. *Jesus.*

Q. What did John do when he saw Jesus?

A. *John tried to stop Him.*

Q. What did John say to Jesus?

A. *I need to be baptized of you, why do you come to me?*

Q. How did Jesus answer John's question?

A. *Let it be so, for this is what God wants us to do.*

Q. What happened as Jesus came out of the water?

A. *The heavens opened.*

Q. What additional great miracle took place?

A. *The Holy Spirit in the form of a dove rested on Jesus.*

Q. What did all the people hear?

A. *God spoke from heaven and said, "this is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased."*

His Temptation

Matthew 4:1-11 Luke 4:9-13

Q. Where did the Holy Spirit lead Jesus after His baptism?

A. *Into the Wilderness.*

Q. How long did Jesus fast and not eat food in the wilderness?

A. *Forty days and nights.*

Q. After Jesus was hungry, how did the devil tempt Him?

A. *He said, "If you are the son of God, turn these stones into bread.*

Q. What was Jesus' reply?

A. *It is written, "man shall not live by bread alone."*

Q. How should man live?

A. *By every word that comes from the mouth of God.*

Q. In the second temptation, where did Satan take Jesus?

A. *To the top of the Temple.*

Q. What did Satan say?

A. *If you are the Son of God throw yourself down.*

Q. What promise did Satan remind Jesus of in the Word of God?

A. Psalm 91:12 The angels would not allow Him to strike His foot against a stone.

Q. How did Jesus answer the devil?

A. It is written, you shall not tempt the Lord your God.

Q. What was the third temptation?

A. Satan took Jesus to a high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world.

Q. What promise did Satan make to Jesus?

A. All this will be yours, if you will just bow down and worship me.

Q. How did Jesus reply?

A. Get away from me Satan, you shall worship the Lord your God and Him only.

Q. Who ministered to Jesus after the devil left Him?

A. The angels came and ministered to Him.

Jesus Chooses His Disciples John 1:35-51

Q. What did John the Baptist say to two of his disciples about Jesus?

A. Look! Here is the Lamb of God.

Q. When the men heard these words, what did they do?

A. They followed Jesus.

Q. When Jesus asked them, what do you want? How did they reply?

A. They asked, teacher where are you staying?

Q. What did Jesus invite them to do?

A. He invited them to His house.

Q. How long did they stay with Jesus?

A. They stayed for the rest of the day.

Q. One of these men was Andrew. What did Andrew do after leaving Jesus?

A. He found his brother, Simon Peter.

Q. What exciting news did Andrew share with Simon?
A. ***Come and see, we have found the Messiah, (the Christ.)***

Q. When Simon met Jesus what did Jesus say to him?
A. ***You are Simon, son of John, you shall be called Peter.***

Q. Who did Jesus find the following day?
A. ***Philip.***

Q. What did Jesus say to Philip?
A. ***“Follow Me.”***

Q. Who did Philip find to introduce to Jesus?
A. ***Nathanael.***

Q. What did Nathanael say when he heard Jesus was from Nazareth?
A. ***Can any good come out of Nazareth.***

Q. What did Phillip say?
A. ***Come and see.***

Q. When Jesus saw Nathanael coming, what did He say?
A. ***Here is a true Israelite, there is nothing false in him.***

Q. What did Jesus say when Nathanael asked, “how do you know me?”
A. ***Jesus said, I saw you under the fig tree, before Philip called you.***

Q. How did Nathanael respond to Jesus?
A. ***He said. You are the Son of God, You are the King of Israel.***

THE MIRACLES

Jesus Turned the Water into Wine

Matthew 1:18-25 - Luke 1:26-80

Q. Where did Jesus perform His first miracle?
A. ***At the wedding feast in Cana of Galilee***

Q. What happened when the host ran out of wine?
A. ***Jesus’ mother Mary asked Jesus to help.***

Q. What did Jesus say to His mother?

A. *My time has not yet come.*

Q. What did Mary say to the servants?

A. *Do whatever He asks you to do.*

Q. What happened after the servants filled the pots with water?

A. *Jesus turned the water into wine.*

Q. What did the best-man say to the groom?

A. *People always serve the best wine first, but you have saved the best wine till last.*

Q. Where did Jesus' family and friends go after the wedding?

A. *They went to Capernaum and stayed for several days.*

Jesus Heals the Nobleman's Son

John 4:46-54

Q. What was the second miracle Jesus performed after he left Judea and came into Israel?

A. *He met a nobleman at Capernaum whose son was very sick.*

Q. What did the nobleman ask of Jesus?

A. *He begged Jesus to come and heal his son, who was nearly dead.*

Q. How did Jesus answer the father?

A. *Jesus said, "go your way, your son lives."*

Q. Who did the father meet on the way home?

A. *His servants who told him that his son lives.*

Q. What time did the sick boy get healed?

A. *At the same hour as Jesus said, "your son lives."*

Q. How did this miracle effect the nobleman's household?

A. *They all believed in Jesus.*

The Mighty Catch of Fish Luke 5:1-11

Q. What did Jesus see standing by the Lake Gennesaret?

A. *Two boats with fishermen.*

Q. Who owned one of the boats?

A. *Simon who was called Peter.*

Q. What did Jesus do when He stepped into Simon's boat?

A. *He taught the multitude who were standing on the bank.*

Q. After Jesus finished speaking to the people. What did He ask Simon to do?

A. *Launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch.*

Q. How did Simon respond to Jesus' request?

A. *We have worked all night and caught nothing.*

Q. What faith filled words did Simon say next?

A. *Nevertheless, at your word, I will let down the net.*

Q. What miracle took place when Simon obeyed the Lord?

A. *They caught so many fish, the net was breaking.*

Q. What did Simon have to do next?

A. *He had to call his partners to help him.*

Q. Who was Simon's partners?

A. *James and his brother John.*

Q. After everyone was astonished, what did Jesus say to Simon Peter?

A. *Do not be afraid, from now on, you will catch men.*

Q. After the fishermen brought their boats to shore, what did the men do?

A. *They left their boats and followed Jesus.*

The Healing of the Demonic

Mark 1:23-26 - Luke 4:33-26

Q. Who did Jesus find in the Synagogue?

A. *A man with an unclean spirit.*

Q. What did this man cry out when he saw Jesus?

A. *“Let us alone, did you come to destroy us? What have we to do with you Jesus?”*

Q. When else did the demonic man say?

A. *“We know who you are. The Holy One of God.”*

Q. What happened when Jesus rebuked him?

A. *The unclean spirit cried out with a loud voice and left him.*

Q. Why were people amazed?

A. *Jesus spoke with authority and the unclean spirit had to obey.*

Jesus Heals Peter’s Mother-in-law

Matthew 8:14-17 - Mark 1:29-31 - Luke 4:38-39

Q. When Jesus arrived at Peter’s house, what did He see?

A. *He saw Peter’s Mother-in-law sick with a fever.*

Q. How did Jesus heal her?

A. *He touched her hand.*

Q. What did Peter’s mother-in-law do next?

A. *She arose and she ministered to them.*

Jesus Cleanses the Leeper

Matthew 8:1-4

Q. What did the leper say as he worshipped Jesus?

A. *If you are willing, you can make me clean.*

Q. What made Jesus respond to the man with leprosy?

A. *His compassion.*

Q. What did Jesus do?

A. *Jesus touched him and said “I am willing, be clean.”*

Q. What did Jesus tell the healed man?

A. *Say nothing to anyone and show yourself to the priests.*

Jesus Heals the Paralyzed Man

Matthew 9:1-8 - Mark 2:1-12 - Luke 5:17-26

Q. Who came to Jesus when He was preaching in a crowded house?

A. *Four men carrying a paralyzed man.*

Q. When they could not get near to Jesus, what did they do?

A. *They went to the roof and let the man down on a bed.*

Q. What did Jesus see by these men's action?

A. *He saw their faith.*

Q. When Jesus healed the *paralyzed man*, what did He say?

A. *"Son, your sins are forgiven you."*

Healing of the Immobile Man

John 5:1-16

Q. What did Jesus say to the invalid man who laid beside the Pool of Bethesda?

A. *Do you want to be made well?*

Q. How long had this man been sick?

A. *Thirty-eight Years.*

Q. *Why were the sick lying beside the Pool of Bethesda?*

A. *They were waiting for an angel to ripple the water, so they could get in first to be healed.*

Q. What did Jesus say to the man?

A. *Jesus said, "get up, take up your bed and walk".*

Q. Why were the Jewish leaders angry with the healed man?

A. *Because he carried his bed on the Sabbath day.*

Restoring the Withered Hand

Matthew 12:9-13 - Mark 3:5 - Luke 6:6-11

Q. Why did the Pharisees ask Jesus, "is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath day?"

A. *Because they wanted to accuse Him.*

Q. What did Jesus say to the man with the withered hand?

A. *Stretch out your hand.*

Q. What happened when the man obeyed?

A. *His hand was restored as whole as his other hand.*

Restores the Centurion's Servant

Matthew 8:5-13 - Luke 7:1-1

Q. Whose servant was laying at home paralyzed?

A. *The centurion's servant.*

Q. How did the centurion answer Jesus, when Jesus said "I will come and heal him.

A. *The centurion said, "Speak the word only."*

Q. Why was Jesus amazed with the centurion's words?

A. *Jesus had not seen such faith in the whole of Israel.*

Q. What did Jesus say to the centurion?

A. *As you have believed, it shall be done for you.*

Jesus Raises the Widow's Son Back to Life

Luke 7:11-16

Q. When Jesus came to a city called Nain. What did He see?

A. *A dead man being carried out to be buried.*

Q. What did Jesus do?

A. *He touched the open coffin and said, "young man, arise."*

Jesus Heals a Demonic

Matthew 12:22-37 - Mark 3:11 - Luke 11:14-15

Q. In Matthew 12:22, who did the people bring to Jesus for healing?

A. *A demonic man who was both blind and mute.*

Q. What did Jesus do?

A. *He healed him.*

Q. How did the people respond?

A. All the people were astonished and said, "Could this be the Son of David?"

Jesus Stills the Storm

Matthew 8:23-27 - Matthew 14:32 - Mark 4:35-41 - Luke 8:22-25

Q. What happened after Jesus and His disciples got into a boat?

A. A fierce storm came and swept waves over the boat.

Q. Where was Jesus during the time of the storm?

A. He was asleep in the bottom of the boat.

Q. What did Jesus do after the disciples woke him?

A. He asked them, why they were fearful and rebuked the storm.

Q. Did the wind and storm obey Him?

A. Yes.

Demons Cast out of Two Men of the Gadarenes

Matthew 8:28-34 - Mark 5:1-20 - Luke 8:26-39

Q. What did the demons in the possessed men cry out to Jesus?

A. Have you come to torment us before our time?

Q. What did the demons beg of Jesus?

A. If you cast us out, permit us to go into the herd of pigs.

Q. What happened to the pigs?

A. They ran into the sea and died.

Q. What happened after the keepers of the pigs ran back to the city?

A. The whole city came out to see Jesus and asked Him to leave.

The Raising of Jairu's Daughter

Matthew 9:18-19 & 23-26 Mark 5:22-23

Mark 5:35-43 Luke 8:41-42 & 49-56

Q. Who was Jairus?

A. A ruler of the synagogue.

Q. What did Jairus want Jesus to do for him?

A. *His daughter was dying and he wanted Jesus to lay hands on her.*

Q. What happened when Jesus was on his way to Jairus' house?

A. *Jairus' servant came and announced that his daughter had died and the Master didn't need to come anymore.*

Q. How did Jesus respond?

A. *Jesus told Jairus to ignore the bad news and not be afraid.*

Q. What did Jesus do next?

A. *He went to the home, took the girl by the hand and said, "little girl, get up" and raised her from the dead.*

Q. What did the woman with the issue of blood, do when she found Jesus?

A. *She touched the hem of His garment.*

Q. How long had she been sick?

A. *Twelve years.*

Q. Did her illness get any better after seeing many doctors?

A. *No. She spent all her money and become even worse.*

Q. What happened after she touched Jesus' hem?

A. *He affliction dried up.*

Q. What did Jesus say to her?

A. *Daughter, your faith has made you whole, go in peace.*

Restores Two Blind Men's Sight

Matthew 9:27-31

Q. Who followed Jesus crying out, "Son of David have mercy on us?"

A. *Two blindmen.*

Q. What did Jesus ask the blindmen?

A. *Do you believe I am able to heal you?*

Q. What did Jesus do after they replied, "yes Lord."?

A. *Jesus touched their eyes and their eyes were opened.*

Q. What warning did Jesus give these men after He healed them?
A. Do not tell anyone about your miracle.

Q. Did the men obey Jesus?
A. No. They spread the good news about Jesus, everywhere.

The Feeding of the Five Thousand **Matthew 14:13-21 - Mark 6:30-44 - Luke 9:10-17**

Q. When Jesus needed a rest, what did He and the disciples do?
A. They withdrew on a boat to a city called Bethsaida.

Q. After they arrived on the other side of the Sea of Galilee, what did they find?
A. They found a great crowd waiting for them.

Q. What did Jesus do?
A. He began to teach them and heal the sick.

Q. As it was late, what did the disciples suggest Jesus should do?
A. Send the people away to buy food.

Q. What was Jesus' reply to His disciples?
A. He said, you give them food to eat.

Q. What food did the disciples find?
A. A little boy offered his lunch of five loaves and two fish.

Q. After the people sat down. What did Jesus do?
A. Jesus held up the five loaves and two fish to God and gave thanks and blessed it.

Q. After the people had eaten, how much food remained?
A. Twelve baskets full.

Q. How many people were fed that day by Jesus?
A. 5000 men plus women and children.

Jesus Walks on the Sea of Galilee
Matthew 14:22-33 - Mark 6:45-52 - John 6:16-21

Q. After Jesus fed the multitude, what did Jesus instruct His disciples to do?

A. To get into the boat and cross over to the other side.

Q. While Jesus stayed to pray, what happened on the Sea of Galilee?

A. A strong sea arose and the waves beat against the boat.

Q. After struggling all night, what did the disciples see in the early hours of the morning?

A. Jesus walking towards them on the water.

Q. When Jesus called, “do not be afraid,” What did Peter say?

A. Lord if that be You, let me come to you.

Q. When Jesus replied, “come”. What did Peter do?

A. He stepped out of the boat and walked on water towards Jesus.

Q. When Peter saw the wind and became afraid and began to sink, what did he cry out?

A. “Lord, save me.”

Q. What did Jesus say when He reached out and saved Peter?

A. “O man of little faith, why did you doubt.”

Q. When Jesus and Peter returned to the boat, what did the disciples do?

A. They worshipped Jesus saying, “You truly are the Son of God.”

Feeding of the 4000
Matthew 15:32-39 - Mark 8:9

Q. After Jesus calmed the sea, where did He go?

A. Jesus went up a mountain and sat down.

Q. Who came to Jesus on the mountain?

A. A great multitude of people.

Q. What did the multitude bring to Jesus?

A. They came with their lame, blind, mute and maimed.

Q. What caused the people to be amazed?

A. *They saw the sick healed.*

Q. How long had the multitude been without food?

A. *For three days.*

Q. How many loaves and fishes did the disciples have?

A. *Seven loaves and a few small fish.*

Q. After Jesus fed the hungry, how many baskets of leftover food was collected?

A. *Seven large baskets.*

The Daughter of the Syro-Phoenician Woman

Matthew 15:21-28 - Mark 7:24-30

Q. What did the Phoenician Canaanite woman cry out to Jesus?

A. *Have mercy on me, my daughter is severely demon possessed?*

Q. What did Jesus say to her when the disciples wanted to send her away?

A. *I was only sent to help the lost sheep of Israel.*

Q. What did the woman do next?

A. *She worshipped Jesus and asked for His help again.*

Q. How did the woman reply to the comment of Jesus, when He talked about throwing bread to the dogs?

A. *She answered, "true Lord, but even the little dogs can eat the crumbs that fall from the master's table."*

Q. How did Jesus respond to her answer?

A. *Great is your faith and this demon is gone out of your daughter.*

Jesus Restores the Deaf-Mute Man

Mark 7:31-37

Q. After Jesus left the region of Tyre and Sidon, who did He meet?

A. *A man who was deaf and had an impediment in his speech.*

Q. What did Jesus do after he took the man aside?

A. *He put His fingers in his ears and spat and touched his tongue.*

Q. What did Jesus then say as He looked up into heaven?

A. Be opened.

Q. What happened as Jesus did this?

A. *Immediately the man's ears were opened and he could speak plainly.*

Q. What did the astonished people say?

A. *He has done all things well. He makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak.*

Restores a Blind Man

Mark 8:22-26

Q. Who did the people bring to Jesus at Bethsaida?

A. *They brought a blind man to be healed.*

Q. What did the people beg Jesus to do?

A. *They begged Him to touch the blind man.*

Q. What did Jesus do?

A. *He took the blind man by the hand and led him outside the town.*

Q. What strange thing did Jesus do next?

A. *He spat on his eyes and then put His hands on him.*

Q. What answer did the man give, when Jesus asked him, if he saw anything?

A. *He answered, "I see men as trees walking."*

Q. How did Jesus respond to this?

A. *Jesus put His hands on him again and told him to look up.*

Q. Was the blind man healed?

A. *Yes! He was restored and could see clearly.*

Jesus Heals the Epileptic Boy

Matthew 17:14-21 - Mark 9:14-29 - Luke 9:37-43

Q. Who met Jesus after He and the disciples came down from the mountain?

A. *A great multitude.*

Q. What did one man cry out?

A. Jesus, help my son, he takes convulsions.

Q. Were the disciples able to cast out this evil spirit?

A. No! They were not able.

Q. When Jesus said to the father, bring your son here. What did the demons do?

A. The demons threw the boy down and he began to convulse.

Q. How did Jesus deal with this evil spirit?

A. Jesus rebuked the spirit, healed the boy and gave him back to his father.

A. The majesty of God.

Tax Money Obtained from a Fish's Mouth

Matthew 17-24-27

Q. What question did the temple tax collectors ask Peter?

A. Does your teacher pay temple tax?

Q. What was Peter's answer?

A. Peter replied, yes.

Q. What question did Jesus ask Peter after he came home?

A. From whom does the king take taxes. From their own son's or from strangers?

Q. What did Peter answer?

A. From strangers.

Q. What did Jesus tell Peter to do next?

A. Peter was to go to the sea and catch a fish. He was to open its mouth and take out a coin.

Q. What was Peter to do with the money?

A. He was to pay the temple tax for both Jesus and himself.

Jesus Restores Ten Lepers

Luke 17:11-19

Q. When Jesus entered a village in Samaria, who called out to Him from afar?

A. *Ten lepers.*

Q. What did the lepers cry out?

A. *Jesus, Master, have mercy on us.*

Q. When Jesus saw them, what did He say to them?

A. *“Go, show yourselves to the priests.”*

Q. What happened as the ten lepers went?

A. *They were cleansed.*

Q. What did one leper do when he was healed?

A. *He returned and fell at the feet of Jesus, glorifying and praising God.*

Q. Was this man an Israelite?

A. *No! He was a Samaritan.*

Q. What special words did Jesus say to him?

A. *Arise, go your way, your faith has made you whole and restored.*

Jesus Opens the Eyes of a Man Born Blind

John 9:1-41

Q. What did the disciples ask about the man who was born blind?

A. *They asked, whose fault was it that this man was blind.*

Q. How did Jesus answer the disciples?

A. *It was not his fault or his parent’s fault that he is blind.*

Q. Whose work was Jesus about to demonstrate?

A. *The work of His Father.*

Q. How did Jesus anoint the blind man’s eyes?

A. *Jesus spat on the ground and made mud out of His saliva.*

Q. What did Jesus tell the man to do next?

A. *To go wash in the Pool of Siloam.*

Q. When the people recognised the man was healed. What did they do?

A. *They took him to the Pharisees.*

Q. On what day had Jesus healed this man's eyes?

A. *On the Sabbath Day.*

Q. What did the man's parent's say to the unbelieving Jews?

A. *He is our son, but we do not know who healed him.*

Q. What did the healed man say to the Jews?

A. *One thing I know, once I was blind, but now I can see.*

Q. What did the blind man do when Jesus said, "I am the Son of God."

A. *He believed and worshipped Jesus.*

Jesus Raises Lazarus from the Dead

John 11:1-46

Q. Who called for Jesus when their brother Lazarus was sick?

A. *Lazarus' sisters, Mary and Martha.*

Q. When Jesus heard about this sickness, what did He say?

A. *This sickness is not unto death, but for the glory of God.*

Q. Even though, Jesus loved Mary, Martha and Lazarus, what did Jesus do?

A. *He stayed two more days at the town where He was.*

Q. What did the disciples say when Jesus said, they would return to Judea again?

A. *No Lord! The Jews want to stone You there.*

Q. What did Jesus say to the disciples then?

A. *"Our friend Lazarus is asleep, but I will go that I may wake him up."*

Q. What was Jesus really saying to the disciples?

A. *Jesus said, "our friend Lazarus is dead."*

Q. How long had Lazarus been in the tomb before Jesus arrived at their home?

A. *Four days.*

Q. Where was Jesus when Martha met Him?

A. *In the town of Bethany.*

Q. What did Martha say to the Lord when she met Him?

A. *Lord! If You had been here, my brother would not have died.*

Q. What did Jesus say to Martha?

A. *Your brother will rise again.*

Q. Who was the next person who came to meet Jesus?

A. *Martha's sister, Mary.*

Q. What words did Mary say to Jesus?

A. *The same as her sister. Lord! If You had been here, my brother would not have died.*

Q. When Jesus came to their house, what did He ask the people?

A. *Where have you laid him?*

Q. When Jesus arrived at the place of burial, what did He see?

A. *He saw a tomb, which was a cave with a large stone covering the opening.*

Q. What did Jesus ask the people to do?

A. *He asked them to roll away the stone.*

Q. How did Jesus raise Lazarus from the dead?

A. *He cried out with a loud voice saying, "Lazarus come forth."*

Q. What happened next?

A. *Lazarus came out and was bound hand and foot with graveclothes.*

Q. What was on his face?

A. *His face was wrapped with a cloth.*

Q. What did Jesus say to the people standing around the gravesite?

A. *Jesus said "Loose him, and let him go."*

Healing the Woman with the Spirit of Infirmity

Luke 13:10-17

Q. Where was Jesus teaching on the Sabbath day?

A. *In one of the synagogues.*

Q. What did Jesus see while He was there?

A. *A woman who was bent over and could not raise herself up.*

Q. How long had she been in this condition?

A. *Eighteen years.*

Q. When Jesus saw her, what did He do?

A. *He call her to Himself and said, “woman, you are loosed from your infirmity.”*

Q. What else did Jesus do?

A. *He laid His hands on her and immediately, she was made straight and glorified God*

Q. Why was the ruler of the synagogue angry?

A. *Because Jesus healed her on the Sabbath day.*

Q. How did Jesus answer the ruler of the synagogue?

A. *Hypocrite! “If you can take your donkey for a drink on the Sabbath, shouldn’t this woman be loosed after 18 years?”*

Jesus Cures a Man with Dropsy

Luke 14:1-6

Q. Where did Jesus go to eat bread on the Sabbath?

A. *He went to a house that belonged to a Pharisee.*

Q. Who was watching Jesus closely?

A. *The lawyers and other Pharisees.*

Q. Who did Jesus see standing before Him?

A. *A man who was suffering from a disease known as ‘dropsy’.*

Q. What question did Jesus ask the lawyers and Pharisees?

A. *Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath?*

Q. When they all kept silent, what did Jesus do?

A. *He healed the man with dropsy and let him go.*

Q. What question did the Lord ask the lawyers and Pharisees?

A. *Which of you would not pull your animal out of a pit, even on the Sabbath?*

Q. Did the Pharisees answer Jesus?

A. *No! They could not answer Him.*

Jesus Restores Sight to Bartimaeus

Mark 10:46-57 – Luke 18:35-43

Q. Who was sitting by the wayside begging, when Jesus and the multitude passed by?

A. *A blind man called Bartimaeus.*

Q. What did Bartimaeus cry out when he heard Jesus was passing by?

A. *Son of David, have mercy on me.*

Q. What did the blind man do, when the multitude told him to be quiet?

A. *He cried out all the more, “Son of David, have mercy on me.”*

Q. What great act of faith did Bartimaeus do, when Jesus called for him?

A. *He threw aside his coat and came to Jesus.*

Q. What did Bartimaeus say when Jesus asked him, “What do you want Me to do for you?”

A. *Bartimaeus answered, “I want to receive my sight.”*

Q. How did Jesus answer?

A. *Go your way, your faith has made you whole.*

Q. What did Bartimaeus do after he received his miracle?

A. *He followed Jesus on the road.*

Jesus Cursed a Fig Tree

Matthew 21:17-22 - Mark 11:12-23 - 12:20-24

Q. When Jesus and His disciples left Bethany, what did they see?

A. *They saw a fig tree a long way off.*

Q. When they came close, did they find any figs?

A. *No! They found nothing on the tree, but leaves.*

Q. What did Jesus say in response to the tree having no fruit?

A. *Let no one eat fruit from you ever again.*

Q. The following morning, as they passed by the tree again, what did Peter say?

A. *Look Rabbi, the fig tree you cursed has withered away.*

Q. What important things did Jesus teach the disciples from this miracle?

A. *That they were to have faith in God.*

PARABLES OF THE KINGDOM

Wise and Foolish Builders

Matthew 7:24-27 - Luke 6:47-49

Q. Who did Jesus liken a man who hears his sayings and does them?

A. *He is like a wise man who built his house on the rock.*

Q. What happened to the wise man's house?

A. *The rain descended, the floods came and the wind blew against his house.*

Q. Did his house fall down?

A. *No. his house stood firm.*

Q. Why did his house stand firm?

A. *Because it was built on a strong foundation, the rock.*

Q. Who is like a foolish builder?

A. *A man who hears the sayings of Jesus and does not do them.*

Q. Where did the foolish man build his house?

A. *He built his house on the sand.*

Q. What happened when the rain, storms and floods came and beat upon that house?

A. *The house fell down and great was the fall of that house.*

Parable of the Sower

Matthew 13:3-9 - Mark 4:3-9 & 14-20 - Luke 8:5 & 8,11-15

Q. When the sower went out to sow, what four kinds of ground did the seed fall upon?

A. * *The wayside*
* *Stony places*
* *Among thorns*
* *Some fell on good ground.*

Q. What happened to the seed that fell by the wayside?

A. *The birds came and ate it.*

Q. What happened to the seeds that fell on stony places?

A. *As there was not much earth, the sun scorched them and they withered away.*

Q. What happened to the seeds that fell among the thorns?

A. *The thorns sprung up and choked them.*

Q. What happened to the seed that fell on good ground?

A. *It grew strong and yielded a crop, some a hundredfold, some sixty and some thirty.*

The Parable of the Sower - Explained

Matthew 13:18-23 - Mark 4:13-20

Q. What does the seed represent in this parable?

A. *The Word of God.*

Q. Who are the ones on the wayside?

A. *They are those who hear the word and Satan steals it out of their heart.*

Q. Who are the ones likened to stony ground?

A. *They who receive God's Word gladly, but as soon as trouble comes, they give up and reject God's Word.*

Q. Who are those who receive seed sown among thorns?

A. *Those that hear the Word then the cares of this world and deceitfulness of riches choke the Word and it becomes unfruitful.*

Q. What happens to those who receive the seed on the good ground and understand it?

A. *They accept the Word and bear fruit. Some a hundredfold, some sixty and some thirty.*

The Parable of the Wheat and Tares

Matthew 13:24-30

Q. How did Jesus liken the Kingdom of Heaven?

A. *It is like a good man who sowed good seed into his field.*

Q. What did the enemy do while men slept?

A. *He came in and sowed tares among the wheat.*

Q. When the servants asked if they should pull out the tares with the wheat, what did the owner say?

A. *No. If you gather the tares, you may also uproot some of the wheat with them.*

Q. What did the owner of the field say?

A. *Let them both grow together until the harvest and then gather the tares into bundles.*

Q. What did the reapers do with the tares?

A. *They bound them into bundles and burnt them.*

Q. What did the reapers do with the wheat?

A. *The wheat was gathered and stored in the barn.*

The Parable of the Tares Explained

Matthew 13:36-43

Q. After Jesus sent the multitude away, what did the disciples ask Him?

A. *Explain to us the meaning of the parable of the tares in the field?*

Q. Who is the One who sows the seed?

A. *Jesus the Son of Man.*

Q. What does the field represent?

A. *The field is the world.*

Q. Who are the good seeds?

A. The good seeds are the children of the kingdom.

Q. Who are the tares?

A. The tares are the children of the wicked-one.

Q. What is the harvest and who are the reapers?

A. The harvest is the end of the age and the reapers are the angels.

Q. What will happen to the tares?

A. They will be gathered together and burnt.

Q. What will happen to the righteous?

A. They will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father.

The Parable of The Mustard Seed

Matthew 13:31-32

Q. What did the sower plant in his garden that describes the kingdom of heaven?

A. A mustard seed.

Q. How does the mustard seed parallel the kingdom of heaven?

A. It is the smallest seed, yet when it is planted, it grows into a great tree.

Q. What kind of shelter does it provide?

A. The birds of the air come and nest in its branches.

The Parable of the Lost Sheep

Matthew 18:10-14 - Luke 15:4-7

Q. Who does God have watching over the lost sheep?

A. The shepherd of the sheep,

Q. Why did Jesus come to the earth?

A. To seek and to save that which was lost.

Q. If a man has a hundred sheep and one of them is lost, what will he do?

A. He will leave the ninety-nine and go out to find and rescue the one lost sheep.

Q. What does the shepherd do when he finds his lost sheep?

A. *He lays it on his shoulders and comes home rejoicing.*

Q. When he comes home, what will he do next?

A. *He will call his friends and neighbors and have a celebration.*

Q. What causes heaven to rejoice and celebrate?

A. *Heaven rejoices over one sinner who repents more than ninety-nine just people who do not need to repent.*

Q. What is the will of our Father, who is in heaven?

A. *That not one of these little ones should be lost.*

The Unmerciful Servant

Matthew 18:21-34

Q. How many times did Jesus say that Peter should forgive his brother?

A. *Seventy times seven.*

Q. To what did Jesus liken the kingdom of heaven to?

A. *It is like a certain king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants.*

Q. Who was brought to the king when he began his accounting?

A. *A servant who owed him ten-thousand talents.*

Q. What did his master command, when the servant could not pay?

A. *He ordered him to be sold with his wife and children.*

Q. When the servant begged him saying, have patience with me and I will repay all. How did the master respond?

A. *The master was moved with compassion and forgave him his debt.*

Q. When the same servant went out and saw a fellow-servant who owed him one-hundred denarii, how did he treat him?

A. *He took him by the throat and said, "pay me all that you owe me."*

Q. When he begged for mercy, did the servant forgive him?

A. *No, he threw him into jail.*

Q. When the king heard about this, what did he say to the unforgiving man?

A. You wicked servant, I forgave you, but you would not forgive your fellow-servant. Now you will be delivered to the jailer until you pay all.

The Wedding Feast

Matthew 22:2-14

Q. What is the kingdom of heaven likened to in this parable?

A. It is likened to a king who as arranged a wedding for his son.

Q. When the King's servant called for the guests, were they willing to come?

A. No, they were not willing to come.

Q. When the king sent out more servants saying everything was ready. Did the people come?

A. No! Some made light of it and went their own way.

Q. What did some of the other invited people do?

A. They treated the king's servants badly and killed some of them.

Q. When the king heard about this, what did he do?

A. He sent out his army and destroyed the murderers.

Q. What did the king say to his servants?

A. Go into the highways and byways and invite as many as you can find to the wedding.

Q. Who did the servants bring back to the wedding banquet?

A. All they could find, both good and bad.

Q. When the king came in, what did he see?

A. A man without a wedding robe.

Q. What did the king ask the man?

A. Friend, how did you come in here without a wedding garment.

Q. How did man respond?

A. He was speechless.

Q. Then what did the king say to his servant?

A. Take him away into outer darkness.

Q. What did the king say next?
A. *Many are called, but few are chosen.*

The Ten Virgins **Matthew 25:1-13**

Q. What did the ten virgins carry as they went out to meet the bridegroom?
A. *They carried their lamps.*

Q. How many of the virgins were wise and how many were foolish?
A. *There were five wise and five foolish.*

Q. What did the five virgins carry with them?
A. *They carried extra oil with their lamps.*

Q. What did the virgins do while the bridegroom was delayed?
A. *They all slumbered and slept.*

Q. What happened when the call came at midnight. ‘The bridegroom is coming?’
A. *They all arose and trimmed their lamps.*

Q. What did the foolish virgins say to the wise?
A. *Give us some of your oil, because our lamps are going out.*

Q. How did the wise virgins answer them?
A. *There will not be enough oil for all of us, go and buy some for yourselves.*

Q. What took place as they went to buy more oil?
A. *The bridegroom came, the door was shut and the wedding began.*

Q. Who went into the wedding before the door was shut?
A. *The wise virgins who were ready.*

Q. What did the bridegroom say to the virgins who were not ready?
A. *I do not know you.*

Q. According to Jesus, what was the moral of this parable?
A. *Watch and be ready, for you do not know the day or the hour the Son of Man is coming.*

The Sheep and the Goat Nations

Matthew 25:31-46

Q. When the Son of Man comes in all His glory, who will come with Him?

A. *All the holy angels will come with Him.*

Q. When Jesus sits on His throne, who will be gathered before Him.

A. *All the nations.*

Q. What will Jesus do with the nations?

A. *He will separate them, one from another as a shepherd divides his sheep from the goats.*

Q. Which nations will be on His righthand side?

A. *The sheep nations.*

Q. What will the king say to these sheep nations?

A. *Come you blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world.*

Q. Why were these people blessed?

A. *Jesus said, when I was hungry, you fed Me; I was thirsty, you gave me drink; I was a stranger, you took Me in; I was naked you clothed Me; I was sick, you visited Me and when I was in prison, you came to me.*

Q. When the righteous asked, “When did we do these things for you. What was the king’s answer?”

A. *When you did these things to others, you did them to Me.*

Q. Did the nations on the left side of the Lord, receive a reward?

A. *No! they had not helped anyone.*

Q. What was the greatest reward for the righteous?

A. *Everlasting Life.*

The Good Samaritan

Luke 10:30-37

Q. What happened to the man who was on his way to Jericho?

A. *Thieves robbed him of his clothes, beat him up and left him for dead.*

Q. What did the priest do when he saw him?

A. *He passed by on the other side of the road.*

Q. Who was the next person to pass him by?

A. A Levite.

Q. Who had compassion and stopped to help this man?

A. A Samaritan.

Q. What did the Samaritan do to help this poor man?

A. He bandaged his wounds and put him on his donkey.

Q. What did the Samaritan do next.

A. He took the wounded man to an Inn to recuperate.

Q. What did the good Samaritan say to the Inn Keeper?

A. Here are two denarii. Take care of him and whatever you spend, I will repay you when I return.

Q. Which of these three men did Jesus say, was the true neighbor of the man who fell among thieves?

A. He who showed mercy on him. The good Samaritan.

Q. What were the last words Jesus said to the lawyer?

A. Go and do likewise.

The Prodigal Son

Luke 15:11-32

Q. A man had two sons. What did the youngest son say to his father?

A. Give me my inheritance now.

Q. What did the father do?

A. He divided his estate between them.

Q. What did the younger son do with his inheritance?

A. He traveled to a far country and misused it all on wasteful living.

Q. What did the young son do when a severe famine hit the land?

A. He joined himself to one of the citizens, who sent him to feed the pigs.

Q. Did anyone help him, when he was hungry?

A. No one helped him. He was so hungry he wanted to eat with the pigs.

Q. When he came to his senses, what did he think of?

A. He thought about his father's servants and how they have plenty of food.

Q. What did the young son plan to do next?

A. He planned to return to his father and ask to be one of his hired servants.

Q. What four things did the prodigal son plan to say to his father?

A. (1) I have sinned against heaven.

(2) I have sinned against you.

(3) I am not worthy to be called your son.

(4) Make me one of your hired servants.

Q. What did the father do when he saw his son a long way off.

A. He had compassion and ran towards him and hugged and kissed him.

Q. Was the son able to ask his father if he could become a servant?

A. No, his father stopped him.

Q. What three things did the father ask his servants to do?

A. To bring out the best robe and put it on him, put a ring on his finger and shoes on his feet.

Q. What were the servants to do next?

A. To bring out the fatted calf for everyone to eat and drink and to celebrate.

Q. What did the father say as they were making merry?

A. My son was dead and he is now alive. He was lost, but now he found.

Q. Why was the older son angry?

A. He felt unappreciated. No one ever made a party for him. He had been faithful, but his younger brother had wasted his entire inheritance.

Q. How did the father plead with his eldest son?

A. He said, son, you are always with me and all that I have is yours.

Q. How did the father explain that it was time to celebrate and rejoice?

A. Because your brother was dead and is alive again, he was lost and is found.

The Rich Man and Lazarus Luke 16:19-31

Q. How did a certain rich man enjoy his wealth?

A. He dressed in expensive fine linen and lived in splendor, having parties every day.

Q. Who was Lazarus?

A. Lazarus was a poor man who laid at the rich man's gate and was covered with sores.

Q. What did Lazarus long for?

A. To eat the crumbs that fell from the rich man's table.

Q. After Lazarus died, where did his spirit go?

A. The angels carried him to Paradise.

Q. When the rich man died and was buried, where did his spirit go?

A. His spirit went to Hades.

Q. While the rich man was in torment. What did he see when he looked up?

A. He saw Abraham far away and Lazarus with him in Paradise.

Q. What did Abraham say to the rich man when he asked him to send Lazarus with some water?

A. Between you and us, there is a great chasm that cannot be crossed.

Q. What did the rich man ask for next?

A. That Abraham would send Lazarus to his father's house and warn his brothers.

Q. How did Abraham reply to the rich man's request?

A. Abraham said, they have the Scriptures given by Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them.

The Pharisee and the Publican

Luke 18:9-14

Q. Who did Jesus speak this parable to?

A. To some people who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others.

Q. Which two men went into the temple to pray?

A. A Pharisee and a tax collector.

Q. How did the Pharisee pray to God?

A. God, I thank you that I am not like others who steal and do wrong, even as this tax collector.

Q. What good things did he boast about to God?

A. I fast twice a week and give one tenth of everything I get.

Q. How did the tax collector come to God?

A. He beat himself on the chest and asked God to forgive him of his sins.

Q. Who did Jesus say went home forgiven?

A. The tax collector.

Q. Why was God able to forgive the tax collector and not the Pharisee?

A. Jesus said, "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

PEOPLE WHO JESUS MINISTERED TO

Jesus and the Rich Young Ruler

Mark 10:17-27 - Matthew 19:16-22

Q. What did the rich young ruler say to Jesus?

A. Good Master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?

Q. How did Jesus answer?

A. Why do you call Me good. There is no one good but God.

Q. What Godly laws did Jesus speak to him about?

A. Do not commit adultery - Do not murder - Do not steal - Do not bear false witness - Do not defraud - honor your father and your mother.

Q. How did the rich young ruler respond to Jesus?

A. He said, "All of these things I have done since my youth."

Q. What was Jesus' response to him?

A. Jesus looked at him and loved him.

Q. What did Jesus say next?

A. One thing you lack. Go your way, sell everything you have, give it to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven. Come take up your cross and follow Me.

Q. How did this young man respond to Jesus' words?

A. He was sad and went away sorrowful for he had great possessions.

Q. What did Jesus explain to His astonished disciples?

A. How hard it is for those who trust in riches to enter the Kingdom of God.

Jesus Meets Zacchaeus **Luke 19:1-10**

Q. Who climbed up a sycamore tree to see Jesus?

A. *Zacchaeus the tax collector.*

Q. Why couldn't Zacchaeus see Jesus over the crowd?

A. *He was a very short man.*

Q. What did Jesus say to him?

A. *Come down quickly, for I'm coming to your house to stay.*

Q. Why did all the people murmur about Jesus being a guest of Zacchaeus?

A. *Because Zacchaeus was a sinner.*

Q. What did Zacchaeus say to Jesus?

A. *I will give half of all my goods to the poor and if I have stolen from anyone, I will repay it fourfold.*

Q. What did Jesus say to Zacchaeus?

A. *Today, salvation has come to your house.*

Jesus Meets Nicodemus **John 3:1-10**

Q. Who came to Jesus at night?

A. *Nicodemus.*

Q. Who was Nicodemus?

A. *He was a Pharisee and a ruler of the Jews.*

Q. What did Nicodemus say to Jesus, when he came to visit Him?

A. *Rabbi, we know you are a teacher sent from God.*

Q. For what reason did Nicodemus know Jesus was sent by God?

A. *Because no one could perform these miracles except God be with Him.*

Q. How did Jesus answer Nicodemus?

A. *Jesus said, "No one can enter God's kingdom without being born again."*

Q. What question did Nicodemus ask Jesus about being born again?

A. *How can a man be born again, when he is old?*

Q. How did Jesus answer him?

A. Jesus explained, a man must be born of water and the Spirit.

Jesus Meets Mary Magdalene

Luke 8:2-3 - Mark 16:9

Q. Who was Mary Magdalene?

A. A woman who was healed of demon possession and her infirmities.

Q. After Jesus rose from the dead, who did He appear to first?

A. Mary Magdalene.

Q. Who went to the disciples and told them Jesus had risen?

A. Mary Magdalene.

The Woman at the Well

John 4:5-43

Q. When Jesus came to the town of Samaria, where did he sit down to take a rest?

A. He sat down at a well called Jacob's Well.

Q. When His disciples went to buy food, who came to draw water from the well?

A. A woman from Samaria.

Q. What did she say when Jesus asked her for a drink?

A. Why do you ask me for a drink? because Jews have no dealings with Samaritans.

Q. How did Jesus answer her?

A. If you knew who you were speaking to, you would have asked Me for living water.

Q. How did the woman reply to this?

A. She said, where do you get this living water. The well is deep and you have nothing to draw with.

Q. What did Jesus say about natural water?

A. Whoever drinks this water will thirst again, but whoever drinks of the water I give him, shall never thirst again.

Q. What did Jesus explain about the living water?

A. The water I give you, will be a spring of water welling up to eternal life.

Q. After Jesus asked the Samaritan woman to call her husband, what else did He say to her?

A. You've had five husbands and the husband you have now, is not your husband.

Q. Did the woman recognize that Jesus was the Messiah?

A. Yes.

Q. When the woman left her water jar and returned to the city, what did she tell the people?

A. Come and see the man who told me everything I ever did. Can this be the Christ?

The Woman Caught in Adultery John 8:3-13

Q. Early one morning Jesus went to the temple, what did He do?

A. He taught the people.

Q. Who did the scribes and Pharisees bring to Jesus?

A. A woman caught in the act of adultery.

Q. What were they hoping Jesus would do with this woman?

A. Judge her by the Law of Moses.

Q. What did the Law of Moses demand?

A. That she should be stoned for her sin.

Q. What action did Jesus take?

A. He stooped down and wrote in the ground with His finger as though He did not hear them.

Q. What happened after the Pharisees continued asking him for an answer?

A. Jesus said. "He who is without sin, let him cast the first stone."

Q. As Jesus continued writing in the sand, what happened?

A. They were convicted of their own sin and left one by one.

Q. Who was the only person left?
A. *The woman who had been accused.*

Q. What did Jesus say to her?
A. *Woman, where are your accusers, has no one condemned you?*

Q. How did she answer Jesus?
A. *She answered, "No one Lord."*

Q. How did Jesus respond?
A. *Neither do I condemn you, go sin no more.*

A Woman Anoints Jesus with Oil **Matthew 26:6-11**

Q. When Jesus was in Bethany, staying with Simon the leper, who came to see Him?
A. *A woman came to Jesus with an alabaster flask filled with expensive fragrant oil.*

Q. What did the woman do with the oil?
A. *She anointed the head of the Lord.*

Q. How did the disciples react to her kindness?
A. *They were indignant and felt it was a waste of money which could have been given to the poor.*

Q. When Jesus became aware of their attitude, what did He say to His disciples?
A. *She has done a good work in pouring this fragrant oil on me, she did it for my burial.*

Q. What action would take place as this gospel was being preached around the world
A. *What she had done would be told as a memorial to her.*

Jesus Blessed the Children **Matthew 19:13-15 - Mark 10:13-16 - Luke 18:15-17**

Q. Why did mothers bring their children to Jesus?
A. *So that Jesus could lay His hands on them and pray for them.*

Q. How did the disciples react when this happened?

A. *The disciples rebuked the people.*

Q. How did Jesus react at their attitude?

A. *He was greatly displeased.*

Q. What did Jesus say to the disciples?

A. *Let the little children come to Me and do not stop them, for such is the Kingdom of Heaven.*

Q. What did Jesus mean by this statement?

A. *Unless you receive the Kingdom of Heaven as a little child, you will not enter the kingdom.*

Q. What did Jesus do with the children then?

A. *He took them in His arms and blessed them.*

Jesus Enters Jerusalem

Mark 11:1-11

Q. Where did Jesus stop on His way to Jerusalem?

A. *The Mount of Olives*

Q. What did Jesus ask His two disciples to bring back from the village?

A. *A young colt on which no one had ridden.*

Q. What were they to say when the owner asked, “why are you doing this?”

A. *The Lord has need of it.*

Q. After they threw their garments on the colt. What did Jesus do?

A. *Jesus sat upon it.*

Q. As Jesus rode to Jerusalem, what did the people do?

A. *The people threw their garments down and spread leafy branches on the road before Jesus.*

Q. What did the people cry out who went before and followed behind Jesus?

A. *Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is He who comes in the Name of the Lord.*

Q. After Jesus looked at the temple, where did He go?

A. *He went to Bethany with the twelve.*

Jesus Cleansed the Temple the Second Time

Mark 11:15-19

Q. After Jesus entered the temple, what did He do?

A. *He drove out the people selling things and overturned the money changers tables.*

Q. What did Jesus say to these people?

A. *“It is written, My house shall be called a House of prayer for all nations, but you have made it a den of thieves.”*

Q. What did the Chief Priests and Scribes want to do when they heard this?

A. *They looked for a way to kill Jesus.*

Q. Why did these men want Jesus dead?

A. *They feared Him because all the people were astonished at His teachings.*

Q. Were these people able to hurt Jesus that day?

A. *No, when evening came Jesus went out of the city.*

The Pharisees try to Trick Jesus

Luke 20:20-26 Mark 12:12-44 Matthew 22:15-22

Q. What trick question did the Pharisees ask Jesus?

A. *Is it right to pay taxes to Caesar or not?*

Q. How did Jesus answer them?

A. *Holding a coin He said, “give to Caesar that which is Caesars and give to God the things that are His.*

Q. What is the greatest commandment?

A. *Love the Lord with all your heart and your neighbor as yourself.*

Q. What did Jesus say about the widow who put a small coin in the offering?

A. *She put more into the offering than the proud rich man, because she gave all that she had.*

Preparing for the Passover
Matthew 26:14-30 - Mark 14:12-25 - Luke 22:1-2

Q. From that time on, what did Judas do?

A. *He looked for an opportunity to betray Jesus.*

Q. What did Jesus instruct Peter and John to do on the first day of the Passover Week?

A. *He instructed them to go into the city and a man carrying a clay jar of water would meet them there.*

Q. What were they to do and say to this man?

A. *Follow him to his house and say, where is the guest room in which I may eat the Passover with my disciples?*

Q. What did the man show the disciples?

A. *A furnished upstairs room, where the disciples could prepare the Passover.*

The Betrayal - The Upper Room Matthew 26:14-25

Q. Which of the twelve disciples betrayed Jesus?

A. *Judas Iscariot*

Q. What did Judas say to the Chief Priests?

A. *What are you willing to give me, if I deliver Jesus to you?*

Q. How much did the chief priests give Judas?

A. *Thirty pieces of silver.*

Q. During the Passover, what happened?

A. *Jesus sat and ate with the twelve disciples.*

Q. What sad news did Jesus reveal to them?

A. *He told them, that one of them would betray Him.*

Q. How did the disciples respond?

A. *Each of them asked Him, "Is it I, Lord?"*

Q. How did Jesus answer them?

A. *He said, "He who dipped his hand with Me in the dish will betray Me."*

Q. Then Judas who was betraying Him asked, “Rabbi is it I?”

A. Jesus replied, “You have said it.”

Last Supper and Communion

Matthew 26:26-31 - Mark 14:12-25

Q. During the last supper, what did Jesus do?

A. Jesus took bread, blessed and broke it and gave it to the disciples.

Q. What did the Lord say about the bread?

A. He said, “take eat, this is My body do this in remembrance of Me.

Q. What did Jesus do next?

A. He took the cup and gave thanks and gave it to them.

Q. What did the Lord say they were to do with the drink?

A. “Drink from it, all of you.”

Q. What did Jesus say to them about the power of the blood?

A. This is My blood of the new covenant, which is shed for many for the remission of sins.

The Lord’s Supper

Matthew 26:17-30 Matthew 26:26-34

Q. While they were eating, what did Jesus do with the bread?

A. He broke it and blessed it saying. Take eat, this is my body.

Q. What happened when Jesus took the cup of wine?

A. Jesus gave thanks to God and gave it to them and they all drank of it.

Q. What did Jesus say about the wine at this time?

A. He said, “this is My blood of the new covenant, which is being poured out for the forgiveness of the sins of many.

Q. What else did Jesus say about the wine?

A. He would not drink of the wine again, until he drank it in the new kingdom.

Q. Why did Jesus say, you will all fall away and be ashamed of me?

A. Because it was written in Zechariah 13:7, “I will strike the shepherd and the sheep will be scattered.

Q. Where did Jesus say He would meet the disciples after He was raised from the dead?

A. Galilee.

Q. How did Peter respond to Jesus?

A. Peter said, “even if others desert you, I will never deny you.”

Q. How did Jesus answer Peter?

A. Jesus replied, “this very night, before the rooster crows twice, you will deny me three times.”

Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane

Matthew 26:36 - Mark 14:32-42 - Luke 22:40-46

Q. When Jesus came to Gethsemane, what did He say to His disciples?

A. Pray that you do not enter into temptation.

Q. What did Jesus do when He withdrew from the disciples?

A. He prayed, “Father, if it be possible, withdraw this cup from me.”

Q. What else did Jesus pray?

A. Yet not My will, but yours be done.

Q. Who came to strengthen Jesus?

A. An angel.

Q. What happened to Jesus as he was praying in anguish and agony?

A. His sweat became like drops of blood, falling down to the ground.

Q. When Jesus rose up from prayer, what did He find His disciples doing?

A. He found them sleeping because of sorrow.

Q. What did Jesus say to them?

A. “Rise up, the hour is come, my betrayer is near.”

The Lord’s Betrayal and Arrest

Matthew 26:47 - Mark 14:43-50 - Luke 22:47-53 - John 18:3-11

Q. Who was leading the crowd towards Jesus?

A. Judas.

Q. What did Judas do when he approached Jesus?

A. *He greeted Jesus and kissed Him.*

Q. Why did Judas greet Jesus with a kiss?

A. *Judas had given them a sign, saying “the one I kiss, is the one to arrest.”*

Q. What did Jesus say to Judas when they came to arrest Him?

A. *“Friend, do what you came for.”*

Q. When the people saw that Jesus was about to be betrayed, what did they say to Jesus?

A. *“Lord, shall we fight with the sword.”*

Q. Who drew his sword and struck the servant of the High Priest and cut off his ear?

A. *Peter the disciple of Jesus.*

Q. What was the servant’s name?

A. *Malchus.*

Q. Was Jesus pleased with this action and what did Jesus do?

A. *No He was not pleased and Jesus healed Malchus’ ear.*

Q. If Jesus were to call upon His Father, could He have been delivered?

A. *Yes! The Father would have sent twelve legions of angels to save Him.*

Q. How did Jesus address the chief priests and elders?

A. *Jesus said, “have you come out to arrest me, as if I were a robber.”*

Q. What did the disciples do after Jesus was arrested?

A. *They all ran away and abandoned Jesus.*

Jesus Before the High Priest

Matthew 26:57-68 - Mark 14:53-65 - Luke 22:66-71 - John 18:19-24

Q. As Jesus was led away to the high priest and all the elders, who followed Him at a distance?

A. *Peter.*

Q. Where did Peter sit in the courtyard?

A. *With the officers and servants warming himself by the fire.*

Q. When all the people gave false witness against Jesus, what did Jesus do?

A. *He kept silent and He did not answer them.*

Q. How did Jesus answer the high priest when He was asked, are you the Christ?

A. *Jesus answered, "I Am, and you shall see the Son of man coming in the clouds of heaven."*

Q. When the high priest called this blasphemy, what did the crowd do?

A. *They all condemned Jesus as guilty and worthy of death.*

Peter's Denial

Matthew 26:69-75 - Mark 14:66-72 - Luke 22:55-62 - John 18:16-27

Q. When the servant girl saw Peter by the fire, what did she say to him?

A. *You were with Jesus the Nazarene too.*

Q. How did Peter reply?

A. *He denied the Lord by saying, "I don't know what you are talking about."*

Q. What happened after Peter walked out on to the porch?

A. *A rooster crowed.*

Q. How did Peter react when the maid told the bystanders. "He is one of them?"

A. *Peter denied it.*

Q. What did Peter do when the bystanders began to say, surely you are a Galilean?

A. *Peter denied it again and began to curse and swear, saying, I do not know this man.*

Q. When Peter heard the rooster crow the second time, what did he remember?

A. *He remembered the words of Jesus, "Before the cock crows twice, you will deny me three times and he cried."*

Jesus Stands Before Pilate

Mathew 27:1

Q. When Jesus stood before Pilate, what did Pilate ask him?

A. ***“Are you the King of the Jews?”***

Q. How did Jesus answer him?

A. ***“You say that I am.”***

Q. When the chief priests accused Jesus and Pilate asked Him again, how did Jesus respond?

A. ***He answered nothing.***

Q. What was Pilate’s custom at the time of the Passover feast?

A. ***He would set one prisoner free, whom the people requested.***

Q. Who did the people cry out for to be released?

A. ***Barabbas.***

Q. What did Pilate ask these people?

A. ***Do you want me to release the King of the Jew.***

Q. When Pilate asked, what will I do with Jesus who is called Christ?

A. ***They all answered, Crucify***

Q. Pilate asked them, “what crime has He committed?”

A. ***The people cried out even louder, crucify Him.***

Q. What did Pilate do when the people insisted on Jesus being crucified?

A. ***Pilate took some water and he washed his hands in front of the people.***

Q. What did Pilate say to the people?

A. ***I am innocent of this man’s blood. It is your responsibility.***

Q. How did the people answer Pilate?

A. ***Let his blood be upon us and on our children.***

Q. How did the soldiers treat Jesus after He was taken from Pilate?

A. ***They stripped Him and put a scarlet robe on Him.***

Q. What did the soldiers do to Jesus next?

A. *They put a crown of thorns on His head and a reed in his hand.*

Q. Did they mock Jesus?

A. *They spat on Him, knelt before Him and called Him the King of the Jews.*

Jesus and the Cross

Matthew 27:32 - 50 - Mark 15:21-41

Luke 26:26-49 - John 19:32-34

Q. What happened after Jesus had been flogged and beaten?

A. *He was led away to be crucified.*

Q. What happened as Jesus was carrying the cross to Mt Calvary?

A. *They found a man called Simon to carry the cross for Jesus.*

Q. What did Jesus say to the women who followed Him and mourned?

A. *Do not weep for Me, but for yourselves and for your children.*

Q. What did Jesus say to His Father for the people who crucified Him?

A. *Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do.*

Q. What did they call the place where Jesus was crucified?

A. *Golgotha.*

Q. What was Golgotha known as by the people?

A. *Place of the Skull.*

Q. Before the soldiers nailed Jesus to the cross, what did they give Him?

A. *They gave Jesus sour wine with myrrh to drink.*

Q. Did Jesus like this?

A. *No! He would not taste it or drink it.*

Q. After they nailed Jesus to the cross, what did the soldiers do?

A. *They divided His garments, by casting lots.*

Q. What time of the day was Jesus crucified?

A. *The third hour of the day.*

Q. What sign did the nail over Jesus on the cross?

A. *Jesus Christ - King of the Jews.*

Q. Who was crucified next to Jesus?

A. *Two robbers, one on either side.*

Q. What did one of the robbers say to Jesus?

A. *If you are the Christ, save yourself and us.*

Q. What did the other robber say?

A. *Lord remember me when you come to Your kingdom.*

Q. How did Jesus respond to this criminal?

A. *Today, you will be with me in Paradise.*

Q. What did people say as they walked by the cross.

A. *If you are the son of God, come down from the cross.*

Q. What did the chief priests and scribes say to Jesus while He hung on the cross?

A. *He saved others. Himself he cannot save.*

Q. What happened between the sixth and ninth hour?

A. *A darkness came over the land.*

Q. What happened at about the ninth hour?

A. *The veil in the temple was torn into two.*

Q. What did Jesus say when He was dying?

A. *My God, My God. Why have you forsaken Me.*

Q. What did Jesus say to His Father when He died?

A. *Father, into your hands I commend My spirit.*

Q. What did the centurion say when he saw these things?

A. *He glorified God and said, certainly this man was a righteous man.*

Jesus' Death and Burial Matt 27:57-61 - John 19:38-32

Q. What happened after Jesus had died?

A. *The soldiers broke the legs of the two robbers.*

Q. What did a soldier do to Jesus' body?

A. He pierced Jesus' side with a spear.

Q. Is there a prophecy in the Old Testament about this happening?

A. Yes! It says, "not one of His bones will be broken." (Psalm 34:20)

Q. After Jesus died, who asked Pilate for His body to bury?

A. Joseph of Arimathea.

Q. Who helped Joseph with the burial of Jesus?

A. Nicodemus.

Q. Where did they lay the Lord's body?

A. Jesus was buried in a tomb.

Q. How did these two men care for the Lord's body?

A. They wrapped it with spices and in strips of linen.

Q. How did they make the tomb secure?

A. They rolled a large stone against the opening.

The Death of Judas Matthew 27:1-10

Q. What did Judas do after he betrayed Jesus?

A. He saw that Jesus was condemned and became sorrowful.

Q. What action did Judas take?

A. He returned to the chief priests and returned the 30 pieces of silver.

Q. What did he say to them?

A. I have sinned and betrayed innocent blood.

Q. What was the chief priest's answer to Judas?

A. What is that to us, you see to it yourself.

Q. What did Judas do with the money he was given?

A. He threw it into the temple.

Q. What did he do next?

A. Judas went away and hung himself.

Q. What did the chief priest do after he picked up the silver coins?

A. They purchased a plot of ground for a burial place for foreigners.

Q. What did they call this place of burial?
A. It is called 'The Field of Blood' to this day.

The Resurrection
Matthew 28:1-20 - Mark 16:1-19

Q. Who came to see the tomb first?
A. Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joseph.

Q. What was Joseph's other name?
A. Barnabas. (Acts 4:36)

Q. What happened at this time?
A. A great earthquake took place.

Q. What caused this earthquake?
A. An angel from heaven came and rolled away the stone and sat on it.

Q. What did this angel look like?
A. His countenance was like lightning and his clothes were as white as snow.

Q. How did the guards react to these happenings?
A. They became like dead men.

Q. What did the angel say to these women?
A. Do not be afraid, I know you seek Jesus who was crucified.

Q. What good news did the angels give them?
A. He said, "he is not here, He is risen."

Q. What else did the angel say to these ladies?
A. Come and see where the Lord laid.

Q. What did the angel tell them what to do?
A. Go quickly and tell His disciples He is risen from the dead.

Q. What happened as the women ran to tell the disciples the good news?
A. Jesus met them and told them to rejoice.

Q. What did the women do next?

A. They held Jesus by His feet and worshipped Him.

Q. What did the guards do after they woke up.

A. They went to the chief priests and told them everything that happened.

Q. What did the elders of the city do with the soldiers?

A. They gave them a large sum of money and told them to lie.

Q. What lie were the soldiers supposed to tell.

A. They were to tell everybody that the disciples came while they were asleep and stole the body of Jesus.

Q. On the first night of the week, what happened?

A. Jesus appeared to the disciples and showed them His nail scared hands.

Q. After Jesus left, what disciple came and didn't believe Jesus had risen?

A. Thomas.

Q. What did Thomas say to them?

A. Unless I see the nail marks in His feet and the scar in His side and put my fingers in them. I will not believe.

Q. One week later, Jesus appeared again, what did Jesus say to Thomas?

A. Put your fingers in my hand and side and stop doubting and believe.

Q. What did Thomas say to Jesus?

A. My Lord and my God.

Jesus Has Breakfast with the Disciples John 21:1-14

Q. Jesus appeared to the disciples again while they were fishing. What happened?

A. Jesus cooked them breakfast, but they didn't recognize Him.

Q. What did Jesus call out?

A. Do you have any food?

Q. What was their answer?

A. No.

Q. What did Jesus command them to do?

A. *Cast your net on the other side of the boat and you will find some.*

Q. What happened when they obeyed?

A. *They caught so many fish, the net was too heavy to pull in.*

Q. What disciple said, “it is the Lord”?

A. *John said it to Peter.*

Q. How did Peter react?

A. *He jumped into the sea.*

Q. What did the disciples see, when they came to land?

A. *Coals of fire, with fish cooking and some bread.*

Q. How many fish did the disciples catch that day?

A. *One hundred and fifty-three.*

Q. How many times had Jesus appeared to the disciples, after His Crucifixion?

A. *This was the third time.*

Q. After breakfast, what did Jesus ask Peter?

A. *Peter, do you love me more than these?*

Q. How did Peter answer Jesus?

A. *Peter said, “yes, Lord, you know I love You.*

Q. How many times did the Lord ask Peter this same question.

A. *Three times.*

Q. When Peter confirmed he loved Jesus the third time, what did Jesus say?

A. *feed My sheep.*

The Assentation of Jesus Mark 16:19

Q. Where did Jesus finally catch up with the eleven disciples?

A. *Near Galilee, at a mountain where Jesus directed them.*

Q. What did Jesus do, before He returned to Heaven?

A. *Jesus lifted His hands and blessed them.*

Q. Q. What happened to Jesus after He spoke to the disciples?
A. *He was taken up into heaven and sat down at the right hand of God.*

The Second Coming of Jesus John 14:1-3

Q. After Jesus told His disciples, He was leaving them. What did He say?
A. *Do not let your heart be troubled, believe in God and Me.*

Q. What promise did Jesus make to the disciples after telling them this?
A. *I go to prepare a place for you, that where I am, you will be also.*

Q. What did Jesus tell them about heaven?
A. *My Father's house has many mansions.*

Q. What was Jesus' promise about returning for them?
A. *I will come again and receive you unto Myself, that where I am, you will be also.*

Q. After Jesus said these things, what happened?
A. *Jesus was taken up before their eyes and a cloud hid Him from their sight.*

Q. As they were looking into the sky, what did the disciples see?
A. *Two men dressed in white standing beside them.*

The Signs of Jesus' Return Matthew 24:3-14

Q. What will Christians see, close to the Lord's return?
A. *War and rumors of wars - famines, pestilences and earthquakes. Christians will be hated and false prophets will deceive many. The Gospel will be preached.*

Q. After Christians see these signs, what did Jesus say will happen?
A. *The end will come.*

The Second Catch of Fish John 21:6-13

Q. When the disciples returned from fishing, who did they see standing on the shore?
A. *They saw Jesus.*

Q. What did the disciples reply, when Jesus asked them if they had caught any fish?

A. *The disciples replied, "no."*

Q. What did Jesus tell them to do?

A. *Cast your net on the right side of the boat and you will find fish.*

Q. What happened when the disciples obeyed?

A. *They were not able to draw in the net, because of the number of fish.*

Q. When all the disciples came back to the shore, what was Jesus doing?

A. *Jesus had made a fire and was cooking some fish which He had laid on some bread.*

Q. What did the Lord asked them to do next?

A. *He asked them to bring some fish that they had just caught.*

Q. How many large fish were caught in the net that Simon Peter had dragged to the shore?

A. *153 fish.*

Q. What did Jesus say to them all?

A. *Come and eat breakfast.*

Q. Why did none of the men ask Him who He was?

A. *They all knew He was the Lord.*

Q. How many times had Jesus now shown Himself to the disciples, after He had been raised from the dead?

A. *Three times.*

The Early Church Acts 1-26

Q. Who wrote the Book of Acts? (Acts 1:1)

A. *Luke the physician.*

Q. Where did the disciples go after Jesus ascended to heaven? (Acts 1:12-14)

A. *They returned to Jerusalem.*

Q. Where did they return to after they arrived in the city of Jerusalem?

A. *To the upper-room.*

Q. What were the disciples to do in the upper room?

A. *They were to wait for the Promise of the Father.*

Q. What was this promise?

A. *The comforter - The Holy Spirit would come upon them.*

Q. How many disciples and followers were in the upper-room?

A. *120.*

Q. After Judas had betrayed Jesus, who took his place as a disciple?

A. *Matthias.*

Q. How was Matthias selected? Acts 1:26

A. *The other disciples cast lots.*

The Day of Pentecost Acts 2:1

Q. What happened on the Day of Pentecost?

A. *Everyone in the upper-room were in one accord.*

Q. What happened next?

A. *They heard a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind and it filled the whole house where they were sitting.*

Q. What did the disciples see?

A. *They saw tongues of fire sitting on each of them.*

Q. What miraculous happening took place after this?

A. *Everyone began to speak in other tongues.*

Q. What was the Apostle Peter empowered to do next?

A. *He preached to the people in the city.*

Q. How many people were saved, when Peter preached?

A. *About 3000 people.*

Q. What happened when Peter and John went to the temple to pray?

A. *They met a crippled man from birth who was begging for money.*

Q. What did Peter say to him?

A. *Silver and gold I do not have, but what I do have, I give to you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise up and walk.*

Q. What action did Peter take next?

A. *He took the crippled man by the right hand and lifted him up.*

Q. Then what happened?

A. *Immediately, his feet and ankle bones received strength.*

Q. How did people know the man had been healed?

A. *He went into the temple, walking, leaping and praising God.*

The Early Church Acts 4:34 – 5:10

Q. What did some Christians do to help the poor and needy?

A. *They sold their homes and gave the money to the disciples to support the poor.*

Q. Who gave his money from the sale of his house and put it at the apostle's feet?

A. *Barnabas.*

Q. What does the name Barnabas mean?

A. *Son of encouragement.*

Q. What married couple did this in Acts chapter 5:1

A. *Ananias and Sapphira.*

Q. Were they honest and truthful when they gave this gift to Peter?

A. *No, they lied and kept back some of the gift.*

Q. What did Peter say to them?

A. *Why has Satan filled your heart to lie against the Holy Spirit?*

Q. What happened when Ananias and Sapphira heard these words?

A. *The fell down and stopped breathing.*

Church Growth of the Early Church Acts 6:1-8

Q. As the young church grew, what became a problem with the new converts?

A. *There was a murmuring against the Hebrews by the Hellenists.*

Q. Who were the Hebrews spoken about in the early church?

A. *They were the Jewish Christian converts.*

Q. Who were the Hellenists?

A. They were Jewish converts who spoke the Greek language.

Q. Why were the Hellenists complaining?

A. Because their widows were not being looked after.

Q. How did the Apostles correct this problem?

A. They appointed seven men, full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom to look after this business.

Q. What did the apostles do after these men were chosen?

A. The Apostles prayed and laid hands on them.

Q. Who were the first two men appointed for this position?

A. Stephen and Philip.

Q. What kind of man was Stephen?

A. He was full of power and did great wonders and signs among the people.

Saul's Early Background Before Becoming a Christian

Q. From what Israelite tribe did Saul come from? (Philippians 3:5)

A. The tribe of Benjamin.

Q. Where was Saul born? (Acts 21:39)

A. Saul was born a Jew and was from Tarsus in Cilicia.

Q. What was Saul's education standard, before becoming a Christian? Acts 22:3

A. Saul was educated at the school of Gamaliel in the city of Jerusalem.

Q. What was Saul's religious background? (Acts 23:6)

A. Saul was a Pharisee and the son of a Pharisee.

Q. Even though Saul was born as an Israelite. What was his citizenship? (Acts 22:26)

A. He was a Roman citizen.

Early life of Saul who became Paul

Q. What was Saul's ambition as a Pharisee to achieve in life?

A. *To persecute the Christians.*

Q. Did Saul stone Stephen? (Acts 8:1)

A. *No! But Saul approved of Stephen being stoned.*

Q. What was Saul's mission at the time of Stephen's stoning. (Acts 9:1-2)

A. *Saul was on a mission to murder the Lord's disciples.*

The Church is Shattered

Acts 8:1-3

Q. After Stephen's death, what happened to the church at Jerusalem?

A. *Great persecution arose, thousands of Christians were attacked and had to flee from Jerusalem.*

Q. Where did they go?

A. *Throughout the region of Judea and Samaria.*

Q. Who stayed behind to buried Stephen?

A. *The Apostles.*

Q. How did Paul make havoc in the church?

A. *He entered houses and dragged people to prison.*

Q. What did the people do who were persecuted?

A. *They went everywhere preaching the gospel.*

Q. Where did Phillip go?

A. *He went to the City of Samaria.*

Q. How did the people of Samaria receive him?

A. *They took notice of Phillip, hearing and seeing the miracles he did.*

Q. Did this make the people happy?

A. *Yes, there was great joy in the city.*

Christ is Preached to an Ethiopian

Acts 8:26-40

Q. When an angel spoke to Phillip, what did the angel ask him to do?

A. *Get up and go along the desert road to Gaza.*

Q. Who did Philip see sitting in his chariot?

A. *A man from Ethiopia, returning from worshipping God in Jerusalem.*

Q. When Phillip came close, what did he hear the man reading?

A. *The Book of Isaiah saying, "He was led like a sheep to be killed."*

Q. When Phillip asked, "do you understand, what you are reading." What did he answer?

A. *I need someone to guide me, please come and sit with me.*

Q. How did Phillip answer the eunuch when he said, "who is the prophet talking about?"

A. *Phillip preached Jesus to him.*

Q. What did the Eunuch say when he came to some water?

A. *I would like to be baptized. I believe Jesus is the Son of God.*

Q. What happened to Phillip when they came up out the water?

A. *The Spirit of the Lord caught Phillip away.*

Saul on the Road to Damascus

Acts 9:1-27

Q. Before Saul embarked on this undertaking, where did he go and for what purpose? (Act 9:1-2)

A. *He visited the High Priest and asked for letters of approval to persecute the Christians.*

Q. What was Saul's next action? (Acts 9:2-4)

A. *We went to Damascus to take Christian men and women as prisoners? (Acts 9:2)*

Q. Where was Saul to take these captured Christians to?

A. *Jerusalem.*

Q. What happened to Saul on his journey to Damascus? (Acts 9:3-6)
A. A light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and he heard a voice say to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?"

Q. What did Saul answer the Lord? (Acts 9:5)
A. Saul's reply was "Who are you, Lord?"

Q. What was Jesus' reply to Saul.
A. I am Jesus who you are persecuting.

Q. What happened to Saul's eyes at that time?
A. His eyes became blind.

Q. What did the Lord say to Saul? (Acts 9:6)
A. Get up and go into the city and you will be told what to do.

Q. What did the men travelling with Saul see?
A. They heard everything that was said, but saw nothing.

Q. How long was Saul blind for?
A. Three days and during that time, he neither ate or drank.

Q. What happened after Saul arrived in Damascus? (Acts 9:10)
A. The Lord spoke to a disciple called Ananias in a vision.

Q. What did the Lord instruct Ananias to do? (Acts 9:11)
A. The Lord told him to go to Judas' house on Straight Street and ask for a man from Tarsus named Saul.

Q. What was Saul doing at this time? (Acts 9:11)
A. He was having a vision and was praying.

Q. What did Saul see in the vision? (Acts 9:12)
A. He saw Ananias lay hands on him and he was healed of blindness.

Q. What had Ananias heard concerning Saul's exploits? (Acts 9:13)
A. He heard about the persecution of the Christians in Jerusalem.

Q. What good news did the Lord tell Ananias about Saul? (Acts 9:15)
A. That Saul was His chosen instrument to carry His name before the Gentiles.

Q. What did Ananias do when he met Saul? (Acts 9:17)

A. He laid his hands on Saul and healed him.

Q. What message did Ananias give to Saul when his eyes were healed?
(Acts 9:17-19)

A. The Lord Jesus who appeared to you on the road as you were coming here, has sent me so that you may see again and be filled with the Holy Spirit

Q. What happened after the scales fell off Saul's eyes?

A. Saul was baptized in water and after taking some food, he was strengthened.

Q. What did Saul do immediately after he became a Christian?
(Acts 9:20)

A. He preached in the Synagogues that Jesus was the Son of God.

Q. After many days, what did the Jews plot against Saul? (Acts 9:23)

A. They plotted to kill Saul.

Q. How did Saul escape? (Acts 9:25)

A. The disciples took him by night and let him down through the wall in a large basket.

Q. After Saul's escape, how did the disciples react, when he tried to join them in Jerusalem? (Acts 9:26)

A. They were afraid of him and did not believe he was a disciple.

Q. How did Barnabas help Saul? (Acts 9:27)

A. He took Saul and introduced him to the Apostles.

Q. What did Barnabas tell the Apostles? (Acts 9:27)

A. He shared Paul's testimony, how he had met Jesus on the road to Damascus.

Apostle Peter Visits Lydda

Acts 9:32 -35

Q. When Peter visited the saints in Lydda, who did he find there?

A. A man called Aeneas.

Q. What serious problem did Aeneas have?

A. He had been bed ridden for eighteen years and was paralyzed.

Q. What did Peter say to him?

A. Jesus heals you, arise and make your bed.

Q. How did Aeneas react?

A. He immediately arose from his bed.

Q. How did this affect the people who saw him?

A. All of the people turned to the Lord.

Dorcas is Restored to Life Acts 9:36-43

Q. Who was the believer who became sick and died in Joppa?

A. Tabitha, who was also called Dorcas.

Q. Why did the people love her?

A. Because she did many good works and kind deeds.

Q. When the disciple's heard Peter was close to Joppa, what did they do?

A. They sent two men and asked Peter to urgently come and pray for her.

Q. Where did they take Peter?

A. To an upper room where they laid her.

Q. Who else was in the upper room?

A. Her weeping widowed friends.

Q. What did they want to show Peter?

A. All of the things Dorcas had made.

Q. After Peter asked them to leave, what did he do?

A. He knelt down and prayed, then he said, "Tabitha arise."

Q. What did Tabitha do when Peter spoke those words?

A. She opened her eyes and when she saw Peter, she sat up.

Q. After Peter gave her his hand and lifted her up, what did he do?

A. He called all the saints and widows and presented her alive.

Q. What took place after this miracle?

A. Many people believed and Peter stayed for many days with Simon the Tanner.

An Angelic Visit and Cornelius

Acts 10:1-8

Q. Who was Cornelius?

A. A Roman centurion who lived in Caesarea.

Q. What do we know about Cornelius?

A. He was a devout man who feared God.

Q. Why did God notice him?

A. He and his family loved God, gave to the poor and prayed to God.

Q. What vision did the Lord give to Cornelius, while he was in prayer?

A. God sent an angel who called him by name.

Q. What did the angel say to him?

A. Your prayers and giving have come up as a memorial before the God.

Q. What did the angel instruct Cornelius to do?

A. Send men to Joppa and look for Simon the Tanner who lives by the sea.

Q. What did Cornelius do after the angel departed?

A. He called the men and explained what had happened and sent them to Joppa.

Q. Where were these servants to find Peter?

A. At the house of Simon the tanner.

Peter's Vision Acts 10:9-16

Q. On the next day, what happened to Peter?

A. Peter went up onto a housetop to pray and became very hungry and wanted to eat.

Q. What else happened to Peter at that time?

A. He fell into a trance.

Q. When Peter fell into a trance, what did he see?

A. *He saw an open and large sheet, let down before him to the earth.*

Q. What did he see inside this sheet?

A. *All kinds of unclean animals, creeping things and birds.*

Q. What did Peter hear?

A. *A voice saying, "Rise Peter, kill and eat."*

Q. What was Peter's reply?

A. *He said, "No! Lord, I have never eaten anything common or unclean.*

Q. What did the voice say the second time?

A. *What God has cleansed, you must not call unclean.*

Q. How many times was this done?

A. *Three times and then the sheet was taken back up into heaven.*

Peter Meets the Servants of Cornelius

Acts 10:17

Q. While Peter was wondering about the vision, what did the Holy Spirit say?

A. *Behold, three men are seeking you. Go and meet them and do not doubt, because I have sent them.*

Q. What did Peter ask the men?

A. *For what reason have you come.*

Q. What was their reply?

A. *They answered, "Cornelius, a man who fears God was visited by an angel and was instructed to summon you to his house.*

Q. When Peter heard this, what did he do.

A. *He invited them to stay the night and the next day, he went with them to Joppa.*

Q. On the following day, what did Peter do?

A. *He went with them to the city of Caesarea.*

Peter Meets Cornelius

Act 10:44-48

Q. Who was waiting for Peter in Caesarea?

A. Cornelius, his family and close friends.

Q. What did Cornelius do when Peter came to his house?

A. He fell on his knees and worshiped him.

Q. How did Peter react to this?

A. Peter lifted him up and said “stand up, I am a man just like you.

Q. What message did Peter preach?

A. In whatever nation, those who fear God and work righteousness is accepted by Him.

Q. What else did Peter preach?

A. The Gospel of salvation.

The Holy Spirit Falls on the Gentiles

Acts 10:44-48

Q. During Peter’s message, what happened to Cornelius’ family and friends?

A. The Holy Spirit fell upon them.

Q. What did Peter do next with these new Christians?

A. He baptized them in water.

Q. While Peter was still speaking these words. What happened?

A. The Holy Spirit fell on those who heard the word.

Q. What made the Jews who came with Peter astonished?

A. Because the Holy Spirit was poured out on the Gentiles.

Q. What did the Jews hear?

A. They heard the Gentiles speak with tongues and magnify the God.

Q. What did Peter say to their reaction?

A. These people need to be baptized in water because they have received the Holy Spirit as we have.

Q. What happened after they were baptized in the Name of the Lord?
A. They asked Peter to stay for a few more days.

The Disciples Concerns with Saul **Acts 11:19-30**

Q. Did the original Apostles accept Paul's ministry in the beginning?
A. No they did not.

Q. Why did the Apostles fear Saul?
A. Because Saul had a bad reputation and had persecuted the early believers.

Q. How did they repair this problem with Saul?
A. They sent Barnabas to meet with Saul in Tarsus.

Q. What kind of man was Barnabas?
A. He was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and faith.

Q. After Saul and Barnabas connected, where did they go?
A. Barnabas took Saul to Antioch.

Q. Who did they meet in Antioch?
A. Agabus, a prophet of the Lord.

Q. In what place was the early church known as Christians?
A. In the City of Antioch.

Peter Cast into Prison by Herod **Acts 12:1-17**

Q. What king harassed the Christians during Peter's ministry?
A. King Herod.

Q. Who did Herod kill at this time?
A. He killed James the brother of John with a sword.

Q. What did Herod do to Peter?
A. He arrested Peter and threw him in prison.

Q. Q. How did the church react to Peter's situation?
A. They prayed to the Lord for his safety.

- Q. How many Roman soldiers guarded Peter in prison?
A. Two, he was chained to and others guarding the prison door.
- Q. During the night, who visited Peter and what happened in the prison?
A. An angel of the Lord stood by him and a light shone in the prison.
- Q. How did the angel wake Peter up from his sleep?
A. By striking him on the side.
- Q. What happened after Peter stood up?
A. The chains fell off his hands.
- Q. What did the angel instruct Peter to do?
A. To get dressed and put his sandals on.
- Q. Where did Peter go after his release from prison?
A. He went to Mary's house.
- Q. Who answered when he knocked on Mary's door?
A. A young girl named Rhoda.
- Q. What did Rhoda do?
A. She left Peter at the door and told the people, who finally let him in.

Paul Sent to the Gentiles

Act 13:1-5

- Q. What happened as Paul and the others ministered to the Lord at Antioch?
A. While Paul sat, learnt and prayed with the other apostles and teachers. The Holy Spirit spoke to them.
- Q. What instruction did the Holy Spirit give to these men of God?
A. Paul and Barnabas were to be separated for the work of the ministry.
- Q. How did this take place?
A. The apostles were inspired by the Holy Spirit to lay hands on them and send them away as missionaries.
- Q. Who travelled with Paul and Barnabas on this venture?
A. Barnabas' nephew, John Mark.

Paul and Barnabas Minister in Salamis

Acts 13:5

Q. When Paul and Barnabas travelled through Salamis, who did they find?

A. *A sorcerer and false prophet called Bar-Jesus and also known as Elymas.*

Q. What was Elymas the sorcerer trying to do?

A. *He was trying to turn the governor away from the faith.*

Q. What did Paul say to him?

A. *You are full of fraud and deceit, you are the son of the devil.*

Q. What happened to this false prophet?

A. *A dark mist came upon him and he went blind for a season.*

Q. How did this effect the governor?

A. *He was astonished and believed the teaching of the Lord.*

Q. What did Paul do after they departed from Perga and came to Antioch?

A. *He went to the Synagogue.*

Q. When it came time for people to bring an exhortation. What happened?

A. *Paul stood up and taught them from the days of King David, up until the resurrection of Jesus.*

Q. How did the Jews react, when the word of the Lord began to spread throughout the whole city?

A. *The Jews expelled them from the city.*

Q. What happened when Paul and Barnabas came to Arconium?

A. *The disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.*

Paul and Barnabas Minister in Lystra Acts 14:8-28

Q. What did Paul say to a cripple man who had never walked since birth?

A. *“Stand up straight on your feet.”*

Q. What did the cripple man do?

A. *He began to leap and walk.*

Q. How did the citizens react when they saw what Paul had done?
A. They said, “the gods have come down in the likeness of men.”

Q. What names did the people give to Barnabas and Paul
A. They called Barnabas ‘Zeus’ and Paul ‘Hermes.’

Q. What did the high priest of Zeus do in honor of the apostles?
A. He intended to sacrifice oxen on their behalf.

Q. How did Paul and Barnabas react to the high priest’s display?
A. They tore their clothes and cried out.

Q. What did they cry out to the people?
A. We are men like you and we preach that you should turn from these useless things to the living God who made heaven and earth.

Q. When the Jews from Antioch came, what did they do to Paul?
A. They stoned and dragged him out of the city believing he was dead.

Q. What actually happened to Paul after he was stoned?
A. The disciples gathered around him and he rose up and went into the city.

Paul and Barnabas Separate **Acts:15:37-39**

Q. Who did Barnabas want to take with them to visit the established churches?
A. John Mark.

Q. Did Paul agree to this idea?
A. No

Q. What was the end result?
A. They parted ways. Barnabas took John Mark and sailed to Cyprus.

Paul and Silas Traveling Together **Acts 15:40**

Q. What happened after Paul chose Silas?
A. They travelled together, strengthening the churches.

Paul Meets Timothy

Acts 16:1

Q. Where did Paul and Silas meet Timothy?

A. *In the city of Derbe.*

Q. What nationality was Timothy?

A. *He had a Jewish mother and Greek father.*

Lydia and the Demonic Girl

Acts 16:14-18

Q. The disciples met a woman named Lydia. Who was this lady?

A. *She was a seller of purple clothes and dyes.*

Q. Did Lydia believe in God?

A. *Yes and after she heard Paul preach, she opened her heart to the Lord.*

Q. What happen next in her life?

A. *Lydia and her family were all baptized.*

Q. Who did the apostles minister to next?

A. *A slave girl who was possessed with a spirit of divination.*

Q. What did this girl do?

A. *She followed Paul and Silas, proclaiming they were the servants of God.*

Q. How long did she follow the apostles?

A. *For many days.*

Q. How did Paul deal with this demonic slave girl?

A. *He said to the demon, "I command you in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her."*

Q. What happened next?

A. *The evil spirit came out that very same hour.*

Paul and Silas Thrown into Prison

Acts 16:22- 38

Q. What did the slave girl's owners do, when they saw she was delivered?

A. *They beat them and threw them into prison.*

Q. What did the people command the jailer to do?

A. *To keep them secure.*

Q. How did the jailer respond to this command?

A. *He put them in the inner prison and fastened their feet in stocks.*

Q. What did Paul and Silas do during this time?

A. *They prayed and sang songs to the Lord.*

Q. During this time, what great happening occurred?

A. *A great earthquake took place and the foundations of the jail were shaken.*

Q. What happened in the jail and to the prisoners during the earthquake?

A. *The doors opened and the prisoner's chains fell off.*

Q. How did the keeper of the prison react when he awoke and saw what happened?

A. *He thought all the prisoners had escaped.*

Q. Did the jailer become afraid?

A. *Yes, he took his sword and was about to kill himself.*

Q. Why did the jailer stop and not cause himself harm?

A. *Paul called out loudly, "do yourself no harm, for we are all here."*

Q. What did the jailer ask Paul and Silas?

A. *Sirs, what must I do to be saved?*

Q. How did Paul reply?

A. *Paul said, "believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and you and your household will be saved."*

Q. What did the jailer do for Paul and Silas?

A. *He washed their stripes*

Q. What did Paul and Silas then do with the jailer and his family.
A. *They baptized them.*

Paul Visits Athens Acts 17:16-34

Q. What disturbed Paul when he visited Athens?
A. *The city was full of idols.*

Q. What did Paul do in Athens?
A. *He went about everyday sharing the good news.*

Q. What did the town's philosophers begin to do?
A. *They disputed Paul's teachings.*

Q. What was the custom of most of the citizens of Athens?
A. *They spent their time listening and talking about the latest ideas.*

Q. What did Paul say to these people?
A. *He said, you are very religious in all your ways.*

Q. What did Paul see displayed around their city?
A. *All kinds of objects of worship.*

Q. What false god did Paul bring to their attention.
A. *An altar with the inscription. 'To An Unknown God.'*

Q. What did Paul reveal to these people in his message?
A. *The whole Gospel, about God the Father and Jesus.*

Q. Did everybody believe Paul's teaching?
A. *No. but there were a number of people converted to the Lord*

Paul Raises Youth From the Dead Acts 20:7-12

Q. What took place when Paul was ministering in the town of Troas?
A. *Paul was in an upstairs room speaking late at night.*

Q. What happened to the young man, who was sitting in the window opening?
A. *He went to sleep and fell out of the third story window.*

Q. In what condition was he when the disciples found him on the ground below?

A. He was taken upstairs and found dead.

Q. How did the Apostle Paul react to this boy's condition?

A. Paul laid on top of the boy and embraced him.

Q. What did Paul say to the people in the room?

A. Do not be troubled because the boy's life is still in him

Q. What was the final result of this injured boy?

A. The people bought the boy into the house totally healed.

Paul meets the Prophet Agabus

Acts 21:8-12

Q. Who was Agabus?

A. He was a prophet who prophesied over Paul.

Q. What did this man do to Paul?

A. He took Paul's belt and tied it to his hands and feet.

Q. What did the prophet Agabus say to Paul?

A. In this way, the Jews in Jerusalem will bind the owner of this belt and will hand him over to the gentiles.

Q. When the Christians heard this, what did they say to Paul?

A. They pleaded with him not to go.

Q. How did Paul respond to their sorrow and weeping?

A. He said, "not only am I ready to be bound, but I am ready to die for the Lord."

Paul is Held in Detention Acts 23:1-35

Q. While Paul was in detention, what did the High Priest Ananias order his assistants to do to Paul?

A. He asked them to hit Paul in the mouth.

Q. Who visited Paul the following night in a vision.

A. The Lord.

Q. What did the Lord say to Paul in the vision?

A. *As you have testified for Me in Jerusalem, you must testify for Me in Rome.*

Q. What conspiracy did the Jews form against Paul?

A. *They took an oath not to eat or drink until Paul was dead.*

Q. How did Paul find out about their wicked plot?

A. *Paul's nephew heard what was taking place and visited the barracks and informed Paul.*

Q. How did Paul deal with this situation?

A. *He called for the centurion who took the boy to the commanding officer.*

Q. How did this commander react?

A. *He organized for 2 centurions along with 200 soldiers and 200 men with spears and 70 horses to take Paul on a journey to save his life.*

Q. Where was Paul going to?

A. *To Jerusalem to see Governor Felix.*

Q. Where was Paul kept guard, while he was in Caesarea?

A. *In Herod's palace.*

Paul Stands Before Felix

Acts 24:1-25

Q. Who brought charges against Paul before Governor Felix?

A. *The High Priest Ananias.*

Q. What crime was Paul accused of?

A. *That Paul was a troublemaker and caused riots in the city.*

Q. When Felix asked Paul to speak, what did he say?

A. *He said, my accusers did not find me arguing with anyone in the temple.*

Q. What else did Paul say to Felix?

A. *These people cannot prove these accusations they accuse me of.*

Q. How did Paul finish his talk at this court before Felix
A. Paul confirmed he lived according to the Law of the prophets and God.

Q. What was Felix's decision for Paul's future?
A. Felix adjourned the hearings.

Q. What did he tell Paul?
A. Paul would be put under guard and the matter to be decided at a later date.

Q. How did Felix instruct the centurion to look after Paul?
A. Paul was to be put under guard, given some freedom and his friends could look after his needs.

Q. Why did Felix interviewed Paul on many occasions?
A. He hoped Paul would offer him a bribe.

Q. What happened after two years had passed?
A. Felix was moved and Porcius Festus took his place.

Q. Why did Felix leave Paul in jail?
A. He wanted to do Paul's accusers a favor.

Q. What did Festus ask Paul?
A. Are you willing to go to Jerusalem and stand trial before me there.

Paul Meets King Agrippa

Acts:25:13-27 & Acts 26:1 - 32

Q. What did Paul answer Festus?
A. I am now standing in Caesar's court where I ought to be tried.

Q. How did Agrippa answer Festus?
A. I would like to hear this man myself.

Q. When Paul was brought before Agrippa, what did Festus announce?
A. The whole community has petitioned that this man should live no longer.

Q. What did Festus say in Paul's defense?
A. He had done nothing deserving of death.

Q. What did King Agrippa give Paul permission to do?

A. *Paul could speak for himself.*

Q. What did Paul speak about?

A. *Paul gave the godly history of Israel, of God's word and his personal testimony.*

Q. What was Agrippa's conclusion of Paul's situation?

A. *Paul had done nothing to deserve imprisonment or death.*

Paul's Voyage to Rome Acts 27:1-44

Q. How was Paul sent to Rome as a prisoner?

A. *On a ship, along with a number of other prisoners.*

Q. What dangerous thing happened on the way to Rome?

A. *A severe storm arose and battered the ship.*

Q. What did Paul say about the sun?

A. *The storm was so bad, they hadn't seen the sun for many days.*

Q. What encouraging word did Paul give those on the ship?

A. *An angel of the Lord stood by me last night.*

Q. What did the angel say to Paul?

A. *Be not be afraid Paul, you must stand trial before Caesar.*

Q. What words of comfort did the angel give to the others on the ship?

A. *No one will be lost who sails with you.*

Q. What happened after fourteen days?

A. *The soldiers let down the lifeboat for themselves.*

Q. What warning did Paul give the centurion and soldiers?

A. *Unless your men stay with the ship, they cannot be saved.*

Q. What did the soldiers do with the lifeboat?

A. *They cut the rope and let the lifeboat float away.*

Q. How many people were on this sinking ship?

A. *276 people were on board.*

- Q. What did Paul encourage these people to do?
A. *He broke bread and gave thanks to God and told them to eat.*
- Q. What happened after they cut the anchor ropes and untied the rudders?
A. *They sailed towards a beach and the ship ran aground.*
- Q. What did the soldiers plan to do with the prisoners?
A. *They planned to kill them, to stop them from swimming away and escaping.*
- Q. Why did the Centurion stop these murders from happening?
A. *He wanted to save Paul from dying.*
- Q. What was the result of the centurion's decision?
A. *Every life was saved.*

Shipwrecked on Island of Malta Acts 28:1-10

- Q. How did the inhabitants of Malta react to the survivors?
A. *They showed them kindness.*
- Q. What did the locals do as the weather was wet, raining and cold?
A. *They made a fire and made them welcome.*
- Q. What happened to Paul as he collected sticks for the fire?
A. *A viper came out of the sticks and latched onto his hand.*
- Q. How did the locals react to this attack on Paul.
A. *The assumed Paul must have been a murderer and he would die.*
- Q. How did Paul react to the viper's attack?
A. *He shock it off into the fire.*
- Q. Did Paul suffer from any negative effects from the snake bite?
A. *No! He did not suffer any ill effect.*
- Q. What did the people say when Paul didn't die?
A. *They said that Paul was a God.*
- Q. Who was the leading citizen who lived on Malta?
A. *A man who was known as, Publius.*

Q. Why did Paul visit Publius?

A. *Because Publius' Father was sick with a fever and had dysentery.*

Q. What did Paul do when he visited the estate?

A. *Paul laid his hands on him and prayed.*

Q. What took place when Paul prayed for the sick man?

A. *Publius' father was healed.*

Q. How did this miracle affect the rest of the island's population?

A. *They all came to Paul for prayer and were all healed.*

The Epistles

Q. What is an Epistle in the Bible?

A. *It is a letter written by a disciple to the churches in the New Testament.*

Q. What apostle wrote more Epistles than anyone else?

A. *Paul the Apostle.*

Q. How many Epistles did Paul write?

A. *Paul wrote fourteen Epistles known as the Pauline Epistles.*

Q. How many Epistles did the other disciples write?

A. *Seven Epistles.*

Q. Who were these disciples?

A. *James, Peter, John and Jude.*

Q. Who was James the writer of the book of James?

A. *He was the brother of Jesus and the leader of the church in Jerusalem.*

Q. Why did Peter write the book of First Peter?

A. *To encourage Christians who were being persecuted.*

Q. What was the basis of his message?

A. *Be brave, stand firm. God has chosen you, but Satan wants to destroy you.*

Q. What other things did Peter encourage them to do?

A. *Not to be impatient waiting for Jesus' return.*

Q. Who was John the apostle?

A. *He was the apostle that Jesus loved.*

Q. Why did he write the three books of John?

A. *That the Christian's joy might be full.*

Q. What message did John preach?

A. *That God is pure light and in Him there is no darkness at all.*

Q. What was his greatest encouragement to the Christians?

A. *To show love to one another.*

Q. Why is love so important?

A. *Because love comes from God and by loving others, we know God better.*

Q. Who was Jude?

A. *He was also a brother of Jesus like James.*

Q. Why did Jude write the book of Jude?

A. *Jude wrote it to defend the truth against false teachers.*

The Book of Revelation

Q. What is the last book of the Bible?

A. *Revelation.*

Q. What is the main theme of Revelation?

A. *The Second Coming of Jesus.*

Q. Who wrote the Book of Revelation?

A. *The Apostle John.*

Q. Why was John imprisoned on the Isle of Patmos?

Q. Who exiled John?

A. *The Roman Emperor.*

Q. What took place on the Lord's Day while John was in exile?

A. Satan, the wicked one.

Q. Who is known as the beast and the false prophet?

A. Satan.

A. He will bind satan and lock him up for a thousand years.

A. The River of Life will flow and the Tree of Life will heal the nations.
